Episode 7 – **The Word Made Flesh, True Bread of Heaven:**

The Mystery of the Liturgy & the Eucharist

This Tuesday at 2pm in the Presbytery

The recently ordained auxiliary Bishop of Archdiocese of Los Angeles produced this series of very lavish one-hour programmes on various aspects of the Faith. He is the key speaker at the coming Eucharistic Congress at Liverpool.



The Eucharistic Congress 2018

Liverpool 7-9th September

As we prepare to send our parish delegates to this event with our support we can reflect on the meaning of Eucharist:

"Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in the middle of them" (Mtt 18:20)

"I will be with you always, even to the end of time" (Matt 28:20)

"Now you are the body of Christ, and each of you is a member of it." (1Cor 12:27)

The Christian Community remained faithful to the teaching of the Apostles, the fellowship, the breaking of bread and the prayers (Acts 2:46)

There are many ways that Jesus is really present in our lives: in the written and proclaimed Word of God in Scripture; in the Sacraments of the Church; in the authority of the Councils of the Church; in the prayer of the Church, in the suffering of Christians, in the consecrated wine at Mass. But the core which holds all these together is that Christ's first presence is in his people – especially when they are gathered together in his name. In continuation of the Old Testament story of God gathering his people in a covenant, "You be my people and I will be your God", the New Covenant is made of Christ's people. As we spend some time reflecting on the importance of the Eucharist we must begin by knowing that, as Church, we are Christ's Eucharistic people – Sacraments, Scripture, doctrine, authority all find their importance in being the "Tradition of the Church".



To gain a further insight into the meaning of "Eucharist" we have to continually return to the origins and meaning of the Church of which we are part. The first name the Church gave itself was "The body of Christ".

The first response the new-born Church had was to "Thank the Father" for all that God had given in what Jesus' death and resurrection has achieved for his people. The word for this action was "Eucharist" – Greek for "Thanksgiving". Thanksgiving is an action and so the Church searched for ways of acting out, showing each other and others, its thanks.

So, what can we do over the next few weeks?

Listen to the present Sunday Gospels.

Ask yourself "What is the Church for?"

How do we thank those people we are grateful to?

How could I / do I thank God the Father for what his Son has done for us - and continues to do?

St Martin & ST Hilda's 20 year celebrations: On 11th September it will be 20 years since St John's and St Chad's entered the agreement to share the chapel in Carleton. On this date this year one this night there will be a prayerful celebration of this sign of Christian collaboration. Please come along. The two new bishops of Lancaster have been invited: Bishop Jill Duff will be attending, but sadly, Bishop Paul Swarbrick has sent apologies as he has been called to Rome that week for a course on how to be a Bishop! Children's Liturgy of the Word – Our team of Catechists are keen to hear from other parishioners who can help us provide a regular liturgy of the Word for our primary school children. Children's Liturgy is exactly that – it is not a play group or creche, but an opportunity for children to develop their faith through sharing the Gospel each week as we adults do (It also allows parents

to listen to the scriptures at Mass without distraction!) My experience has been that adults are amazed at how they grow in faith by praying and sharing scripture with children. Don't be worried if you haven't done this before – we will train and support leaders – very few Children's Liturgists I have known have been teachers! Please speak to Fr Peter or existing Liturgists.

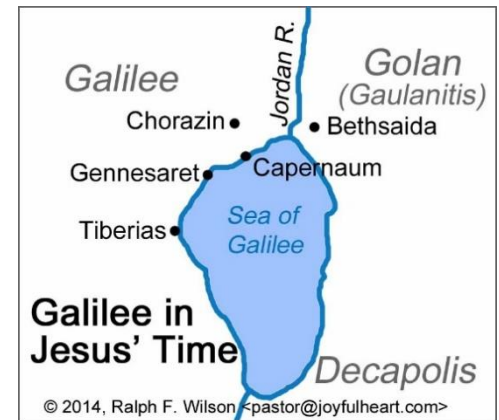
