Do you represent the parish in any particular for which you may feel you need to be police checked for your own safety?

People who work as catechists or Children's Liturgists may regard this as obvious, but sometimes there are individuals who are overlooked – If you feel you fit into this category please speak to one of the Parish Officers for guidance. We do not want anyone to feel they are not given safety.

PARISH SAFEGUARDING

As we begin to open up our parish ministries and events after lockdown it is a good time to check our safety as a community. Peter Embery has been our Safeguarding Officer for a number of years and we thank him for his service to us. Could be also thank two people who volunteered just before COVID and are now starting to make sure we are safe. They are:

Jayne Clark and Michael Muldoon.

They will be speaking to us as Mass in the next weeks. (We are part of the Diocesan Safeguarding Department, which in turn is part of the Catholic Church in England & Wales)

Keeping Children, Young People and Vulnerable adults safe in our care.

We know how important this is in our communities and it is vital that we know the people who work with our people – and that they know how to be safe with them. Most people will know about this through your own work and social groups.

Keeping our Ministers Safe.

'Safeguarding' is also about protecting our own ministers safe from allegations, also. When we are officially working for the Parish we need to be aware of being seen to be safe people. (We know what it is like to open the door to people we don't know who say they are from an organisation we have not heard of!). As a Church we have an obligation to protect ourselves and those who represent our parish.

"Letting 'baddies' know we are watching"

There are some ways of letting 'unseemly' visitors to our church or groups know that we are aware of people who can endanger our children or vulnerable adults. The first way we can do this is for all of us to be honest about the reality of abusers in society and be aware of keeping each other safe (As you would not leave your handbag on the bench in front of strangers as you go to communion?).

Another way for giving messages to abusers is to have things about church which let them know they should 'go somewhere else'! One method I have used in many parishes is to have a parish statement on view which is agreed by all parishioners (not just those with specific ministries) which clearly outlines the fact that Safeguarding is part of our way of acting – and that we are not naïve about abuse and criminality. Could you agree with this statement?

We hope this feeds philosophical parishioners.


The Parish 'ALPHA' Course.
